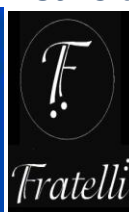

This was always going to be a tough assignment even though we were playing at home this week. Berwick although below us on points were also showing great results against some of the tougher teams.

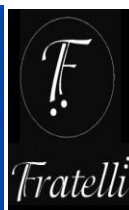
